



Curriculum Assessments (Statutory Assessment Tests) 2023–2024



Meeting to be held Spring
2 (just before Easter).

SATs – Key Facts:



- ▶ Week commencing Monday 13th May 2024 (finish Thursday 16th May);
- ▶ Papers: GPS (x2), Reading (x1) and Maths (x3);
- ▶ Other SATs assessments: Writing (teacher assessed and verified through internal and external moderation procedures).

Year 6 Assessed Writing targets

Working at the expected standard

The pupil can:

- write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting language that shows good awareness of the reader (e.g. the use of the first person in a diary; direct address in instructions and persuasive writing)
- In narratives, describe settings, characters and atmosphere
- Integrate dialogue in narratives to convey character and advance the action
- select vocabulary and grammatical structures that reflect what the writing requires, doing this mostly appropriately (e.g. using contracted forms in dialogues in narrative; using passive verbs to affect how information is presented; using modal verbs to suggest degrees of possibility)
- use a range of devices to build cohesion (e.g. conjunctions, adverbials of time and place, pronouns, synonyms) within and across paragraphs
- use verb tenses consistently and correctly throughout their writing
- use the range of punctuation taught at key stage 2 mostly correctly⁴ (e.g. inverted commas and other punctuation to indicate direct speech)
- spell correctly most words from the year 5 / year 6 spelling list,⁵ and use a dictionary to check the spelling of uncommon or more ambitious vocabulary
- maintain legibility in joined handwriting when writing at speed.³

Working at greater depth

The pupil can:

- write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting the appropriate form and drawing independently on what they have read as models for their own writing (e.g. literary language, characterisation, structure)
- distinguish between the language of speech and writing³ and choose the appropriate register
- exercise an assured and conscious control over levels of formality, particularly through manipulating grammar and vocabulary to achieve this
- use the range of punctuation taught at key stage 2 correctly (e.g. semi-colons, dashes, colons, hyphens) and, when necessary, use such punctuation precisely to enhance meaning and avoid ambiguity.⁴


SATs 2023–24

- ▶ Continual SATs–style assessments, SATs meeting Spring 2, revision books, mock SATs assessments, SATs breakfast club, SATs homework club and intervention groups.




Homework:



- ▶ Reading Book – read every evening (Home Reading Record to be completed weekly);
- ▶ Spellings (Purple Mash) – every evening;
- ▶ Times Tables – every evening;
- ▶ TT Rockstars, DoodleMaths, Reading Plus;
- ▶ Tuesday: At least 1 piece of English and 1 piece of maths homework to consolidate learning. To be returned to school on Monday.
- ▶ Incomplete work to be completed in school.

- ▶ Structured lessons;
(writing is not assessed until June),
- ▶ Treat (Friday 17th May 2024);
- ▶ Residential (Monday 20th – Friday 24th May 2024);
- ▶ Production;

Residential


